

COVID 19 ROADMAP – TERM 4 2020 UPDATE

8/9/20

Dear Families,

As per our letter yesterday, remote/online learning will continue for all our students until the end of this term. **Our school will be closed on Friday 18th September**, making the last day (before school holidays) Thursday 17th September.

We have received further information on what schooling will look like in Term Four 2020. **The first week of Term 4 (October 5th to 9th) will be remote/online learning.** This is following the specific Victorian Government roadmap for Regional Victoria plan, relating to how many active coronavirus (COVID 19) cases are in the community.

All our students will return onsite on Monday 12th October 2020. As a school we have decided not to stagger the return of students, we believe this not necessary in our setting, or at the best interest of our families.

We are expecting updated COVID 19 regulations guidelines from Catholic Education Melbourne soon and we will continue to update families as necessary.

As we look ahead to Week One of Term 4 continuing remote/online learning, we remind you all that the Victorian Government have stated that ALL students who can learn from home, must learn from home. However we understand some families cannot abide this for various reasons.

Prior to your child attending onsite during Week One Term 4 remote learning, you must notify the school and register your family/child's circumstances.

You must provide a VALID reason, that being in line with the government regulations of:

- Essential workers, who cannot work from home (details required)
- Child at risk or disability

It is the responsibility of ALL Victorians to "do their part" in stopping the spread of COVID 19. With this in mind, we emphasis the seriousness of requesting your child to be onsite for Week One Term 4.

Please notify the school by phone or email ASAP, with the reason and days you require your child to be onsite at school Week One Term 4. This is to be done by Wednesday 16th September 2020.

We thank you for your understanding and your support in these challenging times.
